CALL TO ORDER

THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING OF THE VILLAGE OF ROUND LAKE WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY DAN MACGILLIS, VILLAGE PRESIDENT AT 7:11 P.M.

 - Year End 2017 Salary Ordinance
Finance Director Frerichs stated that included in the 2017 budget is a 3% cost of living adjustment (COLA) and a 3.5% step increase for non –union employees. Both Police and Public Works union employees, currently 30 active, are not included in the compensation plan schedule. If the ordinance is approved at the next meeting, he is recommending that the COLA increase be effective the same day. FD Frerichs also provided a history of the salary adjustments over the previous six fiscal years which also stated the step increase recommend in FYE 2017 would be the fourth step increase in the last seven years. The 3% COLA increase would be the fifth adjustment to the salary schedule in the last seven years. He also stated that the number of employees impacted include 17 full-time employees and of the 17 FT employees, 8 are at the highest step (capped) and will only receive the 3% COLA.

Village Administrator Shields summarized for the Board the land that had been donated to the Village that consist of approximately 5.04 acres of which .076 acres are under water and is considered by Lake County records as being wetlands. In the donation of the property in 2011 the Village agreed to develop the land as a park within 13 years or the property reverts back to the owner, so December 2024. In order to be a public park, the private designation must be removed and all the surrounding homeowners must sign releases, 25 have signed thus far and 45 need to be contacted. Currently the property is used as a cut through between the Village of Round Lake and the Village of Round Lake Beach for students going to school and has been used as a dumping ground for items. It was suggested that a guardrail be put in place to prohibit the cut through and would force the students to utilize either Park Road or Woodland to get to their destination. It was mentioned that if the area is cleaned up it could be a point for the Villages residents to access the lake, however it was noted that there is a levy there and it floods when it rains, something very similar to that of New Orleans. It was mentioned that the Village needs to decide what it wants to do with the property, if anything. Need a design and perhaps utilizing an outreach group to maintain the property. It was asked to have the path at least have gravel for the students at this point and it was mentioned to reach out to the Village of Round Lake Beach to see if they were interested in improving their section of the path. The Mayor instructed Public Works Director Wedoff to take a look at the property, to see what needs to be done, what kind of man hours it would take to clean it up and maintain it and then reach out to the Village of RLB to see if they would do a joint effort.

5. SUGGESTED NEW TOPICS

It was asked to discuss the Handicap parking situation at the train station at the next meeting, the Mayor stated that the Villages Ordinance specifies that all parking at the train lot is required to pay and 70% of the surrounding communities charge as well. He stated that if individuals have a Grey or Yellow Placard from the Department of Motor Vehicles, they do park for free, however, others do not. He mentioned that the Police Department had discussed with each of the individuals who regularly park at the station and they all agree that they should pay and there is only one that feels they should not. The Blue Placard only gives them the benefit of a closer parking space. Discussions amongst the board and Chief of Police, as to what direction should be taken and the consensus had been to follow the State Ordinance which would be only those with Grey or Yellow placards are free and those with blue need to pay.

Village Administrator Shields stated that the occupants of Classy Chassis had been asked to move out of the Building that is owned by the Village and they did so this past weekend. VA Shields stated that a possible new agreement could be in place by May 1st however the building is in desperate need of repair between the roof, painting and tuck-pointing. Quotes had been received that had been lower than the amount budgeted and VA Shields asked the board for approval to move forward with the needed improvements right away. Being that there might be safety issues the board agreed.

Executive Summary

Staff is recommending acceptance of the Lake County Bulk Rock Salt Bid for the winter of 2016-2017. The County put together a salt bid for their winter operation needs and included other municipalities that were interested. Last season, the Village ordered 1,726 tons of salt with 500 tons earmarked for the Round Lake School District. This season, the school district will not be getting salt through the Village and staff asked to participate in Lake County's current bid for 1,200 tons. The Village budgeted for \$72.00/ton and the lowest bid was Morton Salt at \$60.22/ton. Last year the salt price was \$69.66/ton from Compass Minerals.

The following bids were received:

- Morton Salt, Inc. \$60.22/ton
- Cargill, Inc. \$73.73/ton
- Compass Minerals \$67.50/ton
- The Detroit Salt Company \$68.52/ton

The proposed work shall entail repaving, grading, removal, replacement and construction of barrier curb, combination curb and gutter, sidewalk, construction of bike racks and other miscellaneous work.

Executive Summary

Staff is requesting permission to purchase a new 5-yard truck and sell existing truck 56 at auction. Truck 56 is a 2001 GMC C8500 dump truck. The truck is 15 years old and has brake problems, the dump box is rusting out and has holes in it, the hydraulic hoses need to be replaced and the plow mold board is rusted out.

A new plow truck will be equipped with a stainless steel body and polycarbonate plows that will not rust and will last through multiple plow chassis. The new plow truck will also be outfitted with a liquid tank and sprayer for anti-icing applications required to remove ice and hard pack from the roadways when it is colder than 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

The Village's current fleet of five yard trucks is all International chassis and Monroe dump bodies and plows. Staff recommends waiving competitive bidding to keep all the vehicles uniform for ease of operation and maintenance. International and Monroe have won the State bid for the last several years indicating they are competitively priced.



Executive Summary

Staff is requesting permission to upgrade the new 5-yard plow truck just delivered by Monroe and International. There was a miscommunication between Monroe, International and the Village about the chassis length of the truck which resulted in a 20 inch gap between the cab and the bed of the truck. International and Monroe have agreed to install a pre-wet system on the truck consisting of two additional 120 gallon tanks to fill the gap, a second liquids pump and a spray bar on the back of the truck at a discounted rate.

The pre-wet system will allow the Village to treat roadways with liquid before snow or ice events to keep precipitation from bonding to the pavement. The system would be monitored and calibrated so the operator can control the amount of liquid being used. The current system is a tank in the back of a truck that gravity feeds to a PVC pipe with holes drilled in it. Staff was intending to purchase a 1000 gallon slide-in spray system (approx. \$15,000) but feel the proposed system may be sufficient to eliminate the need for that purchase.

Recommended Action

Approve a quote from Monroe to install tanks and a pre-wet system on the newly purchased 5-yard plow truck.

Re: Proposed lease terms for the auto body shop at 545 Railroad Avenue between the Village of Round Lake (“Lessor”) and a proposed tenant (“Lessee”)

SUMMARY OF LEASE TERMS

The following is a summary of the proposed lease conditions for that particular part of 545 Railroad Avenue, Round Lake, IL formerly leased by Classy Chassis Auto Clinic and consisting of an automotive garage and adjoining paved lot. As the Lessee is unknown and no Letter of Intent has been signed, various terms are still subject to negotiation.

Leased Area: Only that particular part of the lot at 545 Railroad Avenue consisting of the auto body shop formerly leased to Classy Chassis Auto Clinic and its adjoining paved parking area.

Commencement Date: Lessee will enter the leased area immediately subsequent to the completion of Lessor’s planned repairs.

Proposed Term: To be determined by negotiation with the Lessee. However, if the proposed initial term, plus any extension terms, total more than 20 years then the Village of Round Lake must publish notice of the lease before it is approved by the Village Board. 65 ILCS 5/11-76-2.

Proposed Rent: To be determined by negotiation with the Lessee. However, a late fee of \$50 per day shall accrue for every day rent is unpaid after the fifth day of the month.

Security Deposit: To be determined by negotiation with the Lessee.

Condition of Property: Lessee is to assume the property in its “as-is, where-is” condition, with the exceptions that (1) Lessor shall make certain repairs to the premises subsequent to the lease term and (2) Lessor shall repair any defects discovered in the HVAC within the first nine calendar months of the lease.

Business Hours: The Lessee will covenant to keep their business open during business days and at reasonable hours.

Insurance, Utilities and Taxes: The lease is intended to be entirely triple net with the Lessee paying all snow removal, real estate taxes, insurance and utilities.

Environmental Conditions: Lessee will obey all federal, state and local environmental laws, including those laws regarding the safe disposal of hazardous materials.
