UTILITY BILLING (WATER/SEWER/GARBAGE/RECYCLING)

ESTABLISHING SERVICE/CANCELLING SERVICE

Moving in or out? Please contact the Village Hall/Administrative Department at 847-546-5400 to provide your information.

ATTENTION LANDLORDS

Please visit or contact the Administrative Department when setting up a new service and provide your mailing address, phone number and your tenant's information. **It is your responsibility to pay the utility bill if your tenant neglects to pay.** To cancel service, contact the Administrative Department with a forwarding address so that a final bill is prepared and sent.

VILLAGE UTILITY BILL

The Utility Bill is a combined bill including water, sewer, garbage and recycling.

BILL	DESCRIPTION
MONTHLY BILL	Blue and white color full size page displays current monthly charge and past due balance (if any) sent via postal mail on the 1 st of each month, due on the 20 th of the month
2 ND NOTICE/30 DAYS PAST DUE	Pink post card (depicting 30 days past due balance sent via postal mail)
3 RD NOTICE/60 DAYS PAST DUE – SHUT OFF NOTICE	Yellow post card (depicting 60 days past due balance sent via postal mail)

For payments received after the 20th, a late fee of 10% is assessed. If payment is not made by the 20th, a pink delinquent notice, which is also known as the 2nd notice, will be mailed. If payment is not made by the due date on the pink notice, a yellow shut-off notice, also known as a 3rd notice, showing the full amount owed and the reconnection charges will be mailed. If payment is not made by the due date of the yellow notice, the water will be disconnected and to reconnect the water service, payment must be made in full or payment arrangements must be made. The reconnection fee of \$50 dollars will be placed on your next bill.

WATER SHUT OFF/TURN ON FEES

There is a \$50.00 charge for connection or reconnection of service during normal business hours due to nonpayment of past due bills. For reconnection in off-hours the charge increases to \$100.00.

SILVER LEAF GLEN RESIDENTS

Please note that residents of Silver Leaf Glen are not billed for the sewer service with the water bill. Please contact the Lakes Region Sanitary District at 847-973-8940 to establish the sewer account with them.

DESCRIPTION OF CHARGES	
Village Services	This charge is for the maintenance of the water and sewer lines. Customers are billed a minimum monthly charge for overhead that is a fixed charge and the usage charge for each 1000 gallons of a fraction thereof.
Lake County Sewer	The Village pays Lake County for the delivery and processing of sewerage. All customers are billed this service charge based on usage.
JAWA (CENTRAL LAKE COUNTY JOINT ACTION WATER AGENCY)	The Village purchases water from the Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency (CLCJAWA) . All customers are billed this service charge based on usage. The water rates we pay help to ensure that we continue to maintain the existing water infrastructure so as to provide excellent water services.
Garbage And Recycling	The Village contracts with Waste Management for the garbage and recycling services. These fees are flat fees that are charged monthly.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

- Pay at Village Hall, 442 N. Cedar Lake Road, Round Lake, located between Hart Road and Route 134. Cash, check, money order and credit (MasterCard/Discover/American Express). Note a convenience fee is charged.
- Send check/money order via postal mail to: Village of Round Lake, Village Hall, 442 N. Cedar Lake Road, Round Lake, IL 60073
- Parking Lot Payment Boxes. Payment Boxes are located in the parking lot at Village Hall, 442 N. Cedar Lake Road, and the parking lot of the Round Lake Police and Public Works Facility located at 741 W. Townline Road
- Sign up for Direct Debit. Once you complete the application, mail to: Direct Debit, Village of Round Lake, 442 N. Cedar Lake Road, Round Lake, IL 60073, or bring in to the Village Hall. NOTE: The process to initialize direct debit may take up to 30 days; therefore, the current bill might not be processed through direct debit.
- Pay through an internet service or bank. Please have the payment sent to Round Lake Village Hall at 442 N. Cedar Lake Road, Round Lake, IL 60073. Please note that banks usually cut a check and send via postal mail as a convenience to their customers, so please make payment no less than 7 days in order to arrive by the due date.
- **E-Pay** Pay your water/sewer/garbage bill with your credit card on the website on the homepage, or at the Village Hall. (Visa is not accepted). A convenience fee is charged.

Residential Garbage & Recycling Pickup

The Village contracts with Waste Management for garbage and recycling pickup and therefore providing a convenience to our residents by the joint billing. The garbage and recycling containers must be placed at the end of the driveway, the handles facing the house, by 6:00 AM the day of pickup and no earlier than 6:00 PM the night before. Please contact Waste Management with complaints on the driver or service on the same day of service at 800-796-9696.

Pick-up day for Residents North of Route 120

Garbage and Recycling pick-up is on Mondays from 6:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Please place garbage and recycling containers at the curb after 6:00 p.m. Sunday nights and remove them by 6:00 a.m. on Tuesdays.

Pick-up day for Residents South of Route 120

Garbage and Recycling pick-up is on Tuesdays from 6:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Please place garbage and recycling containers at the curb after 6:00 p.m. Monday nights and remove them by 6:00 a.m. on Wednesdays.

Pick-up day for Residents of SILVER LEAF GLEN AND EMERALD BAY SUBDIVISIONS

Garbage and Recycling pick-up is on Thursdays from 6:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Please place garbage and recycling containers at the curb after 6:00 p.m. Wednesday nights and remove them by 6:00 a.m. on Fridays.

Ordering replacement containers

Please contact the Village's Administrative Department at 847-546-5400 with requests for replacement of either the garbage container or the recycling container. Due to our contract with Waste Management (the combined billing), the replacement request must be done through the Village and not by calling Waste Management. The wait can be up to 10 business days for replacements.

Other garbage items

- Most furniture items will be picked up if they are placed next to the garbage container. The limit is one large item per week.
- Carpeting must be cut to 2 feet in length and each roll must be tied. One large item per week (10 rolls per week).
- Diabetics may request a hazardous materials container from Waste Management or may place used syringes in empty milk bottles with a secured lid.

For items listed below, you must make special arrangements with Waste Management, call Waste Management at 800-796-9696 for details on billing and what items will be accepted or search on the internet for free appliance removal services.

- yard waste (grass clippings, leaves, twigs etc.)
- building debris
- large appliances

Make sure recyclables are clean and all containers such as cans and bottles are empty. Please place the recycle bin on the opposite side of the driveway or at least 3 feet from the refuse cart to allow the driver access to the container.

Here are the first things you need to know when recycling curbside in Lake County, IL. Place these items together in your recycling container:

<p>METAL</p>		<p>ACCEPTED: All clean and empty aluminum cans, foil and foil pans; steel and tin cans; spray cans and paint cans; kitchen pots, pans and trays; utensils.</p> <p><i>Caps, lids, pull tabs and labels may remain on the containers. Place metal lids inside of empty cans</i></p>	<p>NOT ACCEPTED: Propane or helium tanks; needles or syringes; electronics, small appliances, batteries; hangers; wire, holiday lights; ammunition; flares; combustible liquids or gases.</p> <p><i>Metal containers and foil should be clean, empty of all liquids and free of food residue.</i></p>
<p>PLASTIC</p>		<p>ACCEPTED: All clean and empty plastic household containers, bottles of any size; jugs; tubs; cups; clamshell style containers; laundry baskets; hangers; buckets; storage totes; kitty litter tubs; plant pots; unmotorized toys; small non inflatable pools.</p> <p><i>Caps, lids, rings, handles and labels should be left on the plastic containers.</i></p>	<p>NOT ACCEPTED: Foam cups; foam cartons; foam packaging material; plastic bags; plastic wrap; plastic utensils and garden hoses.</p> <p><i>Plastic containers should be clean, empty of all liquids and free of food residue.</i></p>
<p>Clean and empty plastic bags and wrappers should be stuffed into one bag and tied closed. Recycle them at your nearest participating grocery or retail store. Do not place plastic bags and wrap in your recycling container. For more info go to filmrecycling.org</p> <p><i>Include grocery bags; newspaper bags; bread bags; produce bags; zip lock bags; toilet paper, napkin and paper towel wraps; case wrap; diaper wrap; dry cleaning bags; plastic retail bags; bubble wrap; electronic wrap; furniture wrap; tyvek and other plastic shipping envelopes.</i></p> <p><i>DO NOT include frozen food bags, prewashed salad bags, bio-based, degradable or compostable bags.</i></p>			
<p>PAPER</p>		<p>ACCEPTED: Scrap paper; mail; envelopes, including window; copy paper; office paper; shredded paper; cards; cardboard boxes; cereal & frozen food boxes; newspaper; ads; inserts; catalogs; magazines; phone books; hardcover and soft cover books; paper egg cartons; paper cups; milk, juice and other paper beverage cartons; paper tubes; wrapping paper.</p> <p><i>Shredded paper should be bagged.</i></p> <p><i>Cardboard boxes should be flattened and must be cut down to pieces no larger than 3'x 3'.</i></p>	<p>NOT ACCEPTED: Plastic bags, plastic wrap and straws; corrugated cardboard that contains food residue or wax-coating; paper towels; napkins; facial tissue; photos; laminated paper or paper coated with food, wax or foil.</p> <p><i>Paper boxes and cartons should be clean, empty and free of all liquid, food residue or packing materials.</i></p>
<p>GLASS</p>		<p>ACCEPTED: Clean and empty glass bottles and jars, all colors.</p> <p><i>Remove all caps and lids.</i></p>	<p>NOT ACCEPTED: Light bulbs; drink glasses; ceramics; bakeware; mirrors; ornamental glass; window and auto glass.</p> <p><i>Glass containers should be clean, empty of all liquids and free of food residue.</i></p>

gently used or worn, clothing and textiles. Curtains, quilts, blankets, towels, bedspreads, sheets, sofa covers, tablecloths...

February – Valentine’s Day – Go Green Week or Love Your Neighbor Week – can tie in with any of these.

March – Spring Equinox – Spring Cleaning out the closets.

April – Earth Month, April Showers – we will take Rain Coats and Windbreakers – rain boots can be recycled through Reuse-A-Shoe.

May – National Pet Week - Pet costumes, sweaters, coats and clothing accepted.

June – Weddings – Formal Dresses, Suits, Tuxedos, and other Formal Wear; also T-Shirt Day falls in June . **July** – Red White Blue – Picnic Month – you can bring us a number of different textiles to reuse or recycle: picnic blankets, table linens, towels...

August – End of Summer – As you pack up your Spring and Summer Clothing, bring us any unwanted or outgrown.....

September – Back to School – we will accept backpacks and tote bags, along with last year’s outgrown school clothes.

October – Did you know you can drop off your unwanted or outgrown Halloween Costumes in the Clothing and Textile Bin? People or Pet!

November – America Recycles Day – November 15 every year – 85% of all clothing and textiles end up in the landfill in the US each year.

December – Winter begins – winter clothing including sweatshirts, coats, mittens, gloves, scarves and hats.



Community Garden

The Community Garden is located at the Round Lake Police & Public Works Facility on Townline and Bacon Roads. Applications are available at the Village Hall or www.eroundlake.com.

Special Events

The Village holds Special Events throughout the year including Arbor Day (usually in May), Home Town Festival (summer), National Night Out (early August), and a Tree Lighting Ceremony (early December). All residents are invited to attend.

Voter Registration & Public Notary Services

The Village offers notary services and voter registration. Please stop by the Administrative Department at Village Hall during normal business hours for these services.

Garage Sale Permits

The Village of Round Lake **does not** have a requirement for garage sale permits.

Hydrant Flushing

Regular fire hydrant flushing allows the Village to reduce sediments and other solids that collect in our water mains, thereby allowing us to provide our residents with cleaner water to your homes and businesses. The Round Lake Public Works Department normally flushes fire hydrants in the springtime. Please watch for signs when hydrants in your neighborhood are scheduled to be flushed. It is not advisable to wash laundry while hydrants are being flushed because the flushed water may discolor the clothing.

Mosquito Control

The Village of Round Lake has contracted with Clarke Environmental for the Mosquito Abatement Program. If a resident would like to be placed on their notification list of when future spraying will take place – for health reasons or just to be notified – please call Clarke at 800-942-2555.

For information on West Nile and its impact in Illinois, see the Illinois Department of Public Health's website. For information on West Nile's impact on the US in general, see the CDC's West Nile site - an excellent web page that shows details on the statistics, surveillance, and control of the Virus. Mosquitoes are most prevalent at dawn, dusk and early evening.

Residents' Responsibilities: Each homeowner should locate and eliminate potential breeding sites by emptying standing water from children's pools, gutters, recycling bins and other artificial containers. Please use residential mosquito control sprays for your yard using sprays that hook up to garden hose or other chemicals found at most hardware and department stores.

Individual Protection: Use mosquito repellent when outdoors between dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active. Be sure window screens provide sufficient protection. If you must be outdoors during these times, wear long-sleeved clothing and pants. Use insect repellent sparingly.

Village vehicle stickers

The Village of Round Lake **does not** have a requirement of vehicle stickers.

Parking limits on Village Streets and sidewalks

No parking is allowed on any Village street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. If an unusual circumstance occurs, such as an overnight guest or paving or coating driveways, residents should call the police department's non-emergency number (847) 270-9111 to notify them of the specifics such as the address, type of car, and duration. No parking is allowed on Village streets during snowfall so as to allow proper snow removal by the snow plow. It is also prohibited to park so as to block sidewalks (even by an inch).

Don't construct a fence/driveway/deck without a building permit!

The purpose and function of the Village of Round Lake Building Department is to ensure public safety, health and welfare, during building construction and renovation to secure the safety of life and property from hazards incidental to the design, erection, repair and occupancy of buildings through proper inspection practices; and to preserve the appearance and property value of existing housing through efficient code enforcement. Building permit applications may be filed by the property owner or by the owner's authorized agent, such as the design professional or the contractor who will be doing the work. The person to whom the building permit is issued is legally responsible for the proper construction of the project, obtaining the required inspections and the satisfactory completion of the work authorized by the permit. Tree Removal - Don't cut down that tree! A Tree Removal Permit is required for removing trees and depending on the type of tree, replacement may also be required. Please contact the Building Department at 847-546-0963 for further information.

Sprinkling Restrictions

WATERING / SPRINKLING REGULATIONS are IN EFFECT SUMMER until September 15th.

During restricted periods, watering your lawn is prohibited between the hours of noon and 6:00 PM, Monday – Friday. However, during these periods, residents with even-numbered addresses may water on even-numbered days and those with odd-numbered addresses may water on odd-numbered days outside of the restricted hours. Newly sodded or seeded areas may be watered at anytime for a two-week period following installation.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Pace Bus

The Pace Bus Route 570 serves Round Lake commuters. The bus stop is located at Cedar Lake Road and Washington Road. This route connects to bus routes 565, 572, and 806. For more information on Pace visit www.pacebus.com.

Metra

The MILWAUKEE DISTRICT/NORTH LINE (FOX LAKE TO CHICAGO) serves Round Lake commuters. The Metra station is located at the intersection of Route 134 and Cedar Lake Road. Metra owns the station and the Village maintains the lots. For more information on Metra, visit www.metrarail.com.

Parking is available daily on a first-come, first-serve basis for a fee of **\$1.50 a day**. Payment can be made by dollar bills and coins at each lot's collection box or by purchasing a Quarterly Parking Pass at the Village Hall. Quarterly Passes are \$90 at the start of the quarter and thereafter the cost is prorated. Forms of payment: Cash/Check/Credit (no Visa). Note when paying by credit, a convenience fee is charged. The lot that is located off Goodnow Blvd is the only parking lot designated for pass holders alone, but pass holders are allowed to park in the other Round Lake Station parking lots.
